



federalised structure for **Structure**, and therefore also World Heritage.

Immovable heritage and associated <u>policies</u> are managed <u>independently</u> by the three regions: Flanders, Wallonia, and Brussels.

Each region has its <u>own</u> <u>legislation</u>, minister, and focal points.

In relation to World Heritage, even though each region is entirely responsible for what happens on its territory, there is some coordination.





State party to the World Heritage Convention since 1996



Belgium was relatively late in joining UNESCO's World Heritage Convention in 1996.

The delay was mainly due to the federal system and the need to coordinate between the different regions.

The first Belgian properties were added to the World Heritage list in 1998.



Flemish World Heritage Overview

Flanders has 8 World Heritage properties out of Belgium's 16, including several serial and transnational properties.

Sites range from historic city centres and beech forests to 1st World War heritage.

Flanders plays a vital role in the broader European context of World Heritage through its transnational properties.







Absence of an Umbrella Organisation in Flanders



Flanders currently lacks a central umbrella organisation to coordinate the management of its World Heritage sites.

Even serial World Heritage sites do not have formal coordination structures in place, meaning collaboration with foreign counterparts in transnational series currently is ad hoc.

The formation of such an organisation is expected to be part of the agenda in the upcoming legislative period.




Interim Ad-Hoc Collaborations

Despite the lack of a formal structure, Flanders engages regularly with counterparts in neighbouring countries, particularly the Netherlands.

These collaborations focus on knowledge exchange and specific joint projects, such as translating and promoting UNESCO's Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) guidance.

This partnership enhances management practices in both countries and fosters crossborder cooperation.








Assisting the management of protected immovable Heritage


